## **Stewardship Saturday: Uncovering the Wonders of Wetlands**

## So What?

Through our partnership with the San Francisco Bay Bird Observatory and The Marine Mammal Center, we explored the Bay's wetlands by nature journaling and helping maintain chick shelters. These hands-on experiences deepened our appreciation for the Bay's incredible biodiversity and revealed how wetlands serve as vital habitats, providing feeding, resting and migration areas for birds and marine life. We discovered that protecting these ecosystems benefits not only marine mammals, but also migratory birds and countless other species that rely on wetlands to survive.

## Now What?
